Total Defence Day

Total Defence Day falls on 15 February each year. This year, our school commemorated Total Defence Day from 14 to 18 February 2022 during recess, CCE lessons and FTGP lessons.

Throughout the week, our students learned about why it is important to strengthen our resolve to keep Singapore safe, secure and sovereign. They learnt about Singapore's Total Defence capability via the six pillars of defence: Military, Civil, Economic, Social, Digital and Psychological Defence and how they each play a part in contributing to Singapore's defence.

This day is also a meaningful one in the history of our school and our Canossian Sisters. Students watched a special video clip about our Sisters during the days of World War II. Canossian Saints' Week Celebration

Prior to the launch of Canossian Saints Week, as part of the school's commemoration of Total Defence Day, our students learnt about how the Canossian Sisters emulated our Canossian Saints in the way they loved and cared for the children under their charge during the March to Bahau in 1942.

A week-long celebration in honour of our Canossian Saints was launched on 21 February. Our students reflected on

the lives and legacies of our Foundress, St Magdalene, and our Universal Sister, St Josephine Bakhita, during their Values Education lesson. In line with the school's theme of *Act Justly, Love Kindly, Walk Humbly*, the students then thought about how they could carry on this legacy as Canossian students through their words and actions.

During recess for each day of the week, students took part in different activities led by two groups of Student Leaders, namely the Catholic Student Leaders and the Prefects. The younger students liked listening to the stories of the lives of our Canossian Saints, their sacrifices and love for the people they served. Our Catholic Student Leaders told these stories with enthusiasm and quizzed their schoolmates to deepen their knowledge and love for our Canossian Saints.

Students particularly enjoyed the activity where they reflected on their actions as Canossian Leaders to Act Justly, Love Kindly, Walk Humbly. Our Head Girl, Valerie, explained each part of the theme to the whole

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school at the morning assembly over 3 days. Little cards with the icons of the hand, heart and foot representing *Act Justly, Love Kindly, Walk Humbly* respectively, were given to each student to write pledges on how they choose to live out the school theme. During recess, our Prefects helmed activities which focused on helping our students become more familiar with our 10 Principles of Canossian Leadership. They encouraged our students to learn the Canossian Leadership Principles. Students submitted the little cards to the Prefects, which were used to design a few collages and these were offered up at Canossian Saints' Day Mass as a promise to live our Principles to be the best of our ability.

Canossian Saints' Day

The week-long Canossian Saints' week celebration culminated in a Eucharistic Celebration on 28 February when the school came together to thank God for the gift of our Canossian Saints – St Magdalene of Canossa and St Josephine Bakhita – from whom we learn the values of Charity, Humility, Forgiveness and Faith. At the Mass, we prayed that our faith will be strengthened as we walk in the way that the Canossian Saints did through our daily actions.

The celebrant of our special Mass was Friar Derrick, who shared the message that love has its origins in the word *agape* and *caritas*, which means love and charity. When St Bakhita forgave her slave masters, her forgiveness showed the love she had for them. Our Foundress' heart was so full of love for the people around her that she reached out to them. Hence, we should all learn to forgive others for any wrongdoings and do our best to reach out to those around us who are in need.

After the beautiful Mass celebration, students learnt about the meaning of Lent and the three Lenten practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. As Lent is a period for us to grow in charity, students were encouraged to participate actively in the school's Lenten Project by carrying out *Acts of Mercy* and donating to the needy through their hand-made *Gift of Love* boxes.

Teachers also led the students in a class activity to recall what they had learnt during Canossian Saints' Week. This was followed by a class discussion to deepen their understanding of the 10 Canossian Leadership Principles and how they can uphold them.

The P3 to P6 Peer Support Leaders encouraged their peers to build a positive and caring class culture. They helped to facilitate a class activity to appreciate everyone's uniqueness. Students affirmed a buddy within their group to make them feel valued and appreciated.

Interest Week: Discovering the Unique Me!

Discovering the Unique Me! aims to inspire our students to aspire by providing platforms for them to explore their values, interests, personalities and skills, raise their awareness of different types of education and career pathways and equip themselves with the values, skills and dispositions of lifelong learning to make informed choices regarding their education.

Recognising that every child is different and has varied interests and passions, our students were given the opportunity to explore and discover their interests in 12 different modules - Animation, Cajon, Cartooning, Culinary, Design, Drama, Entrepreneurship, Inline Skate, Jazz Dance, Media, Soccer and Urban Farming.

The 5-day programme was broken down into 3 segments - Experience, Encounter and Engage. During the Experience stage, our students acquired new knowledge, skills and dispositions from their teachers, instructors or coaches. For instance, those who participated in the Entrepreneurship module acquired the skills and knowledge to start and run a business. As Leaders of Hope and Sowers of Change, they came up with a business plan to sell handmade items to raise funds for the elderly in Villa Francis and St Joseph's Home. Knowing their purpose, the students publicised this event using the posters that they had designed to appeal to all students and teachers to support their cause. Their first foray in 'business' turned out to be a great success as all items were sold out by the end of the day. The students raised \$256.20 in that one day!

On the final day of the programme, our students had the opportunity to meet with professionals from the respective industries. During this *Encounter* stage, they were blessed to have meaningful conversations with the guest speakers via Zoom.

Chew Caelyn (4 Joy) said after listening to the sharing by the guest speaker, Natalie Mae Tan, a child actress and dance student from School of the Arts (SOTA).

Discovering the Unique Me! has allowed our children to understand that challenges present opportunities for them to grow. They are also keenly aware that they can always make things better. May our children continue to love and develop their interests and passions and never grow weary or tired of the journey.
